Local Board of DD president reelected to statewide post

NEWARK -- David Wigginton, president of the Licking County Board of Developmental Disabilities, has been reelected to a second term on the Board of Trustees for the Ohio Association of County Boards Serving People with Developmental Disabilities (OACB).

Wigginton has served on the local Board of DD for six years, and on the OACB Board of Trustees for two years. Throughout 2011, he served as the OACB secretary. The OACB membership includes all 88 county boards of developmental disabilities.

Wigginton is a Newark attorney with Schaller, Campbell & Untied. He has a long history of serving local community organizations. He has served on the Board of Directors for the Licking County United Way, and as board president of Mental Health America of Licking County.

The Licking County Board of Developmental Disabilities provides comprehensive services to more than 1,400 Licking County infants, children and adults. These include Early Intervention Services for infants and toddlers up to age three; Adult Services provided by LICCO Inc., Heath, and other organizations such as Consumer Support Services, SPARK LLC, Midwest Innovations, The Gathering Place and the Center for Disability Services' Colvin-Hoover House. The local Board of DD also provides residential supports; adaptive equipment and home modifications; respite care for families; contracted transportation services through the Licking County Transit Board; and Service Coordination/Case Management.

The Licking County Board of Developmental Disabilities is nationally accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) for offering high-quality support services to individuals with developmental disabilities and their families.
